## 20 Memorable Moments from 2021

We entered 2021 more mission-minded than ever. Lessons learned from a year of responding to a global crisis inspired us to dream bigger, pray harder and serve more fervently than ever before. Here are a few moments from 2021, in which our commitment, expertise and passion manifested as milestone moments in our mission to help one more child.

### 1. Every Child, Every City

We officially launched our Every Child, Every City initiatives that provide simple on-ramps for churches, groups and businesses to change the lives of children in their communities. We train, provide resources and ongoing support and partner across the country to feed hungry children, protect vulnerable children, support single moms and make a difference through foster care. ### 6. On the Front Lines of Anti-Trafficking

For the third year in a row, One More Child was a leading voice at JuST Conference, the largest juvenile anti-trafficking conference in the United States. Additionally, our Anti-Trafficking team strengthened its reputation as an expert voice in trauma-informed care by consulting regularly with law enforcement agencies.

#### Azinger Family Compassion Center

The long-awaited Azinger Family Compassion Center opened on our Guardian Angels of SW Florida Campus in October. We are thankful for faithful partners Paul and Toni Azinger, as well as Steve and Natalee Herrig, who were instrumental in making this dream a reality. We estimate that thousands of families and children will receive the help they need, and more than 4 million meals will be served through this Bradenton location in its first five years alone.

#### Jobs for Life Launch

We launched Jobs for Life and celebrated our first graduates in 2021. The 8-week faith-based curriculum focuses on the value of work, building job skills and connecting participants with community partners and resources. We are excited to help more individuals reach their career goals.

#### More Keys to Success






### 9.

### 4. Children Helping Children



Sometimes it takes one more child to help One More Child. We saw this time and time again in 2021. Five-year-old Katie passed out fliers in her neighborhood so she could collect blankets for children in our care. Katie's efforts garnered 212 blankets and touched countless lives. Another child, TJ, launched a Facebook appeal to collect diapers for our annual Diaper Drive, and just before Thanksgiving, this bubbly 4-year-old and his mom showed up to deliver 3,467 diapers.



### 10.

#### Equipped to Help Even More

We celebrated securing a 3.1 million dollar grant to continue efforts to help more victims of trafficking and protect more vulnerable children. The Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) grant, awarded through the Florida Attorney General's office, will allow One More Child to provide direct care services in more communities than ever before.

## 11. Reaching Across Cultures Through Classrooms

Students can now reach across countries and cultures, thanks to our Global Classmates program. This new program pairs students from K-12 schools with their counterparts in other countries, allowing them to make an impact and build friendships. Students connect in meaningful ways, and through the partnership, schools can provide critical nutrition, medical care, education, Christian teaching and more.



## 12. Focusing on Children in Foster Care

The foster care system is strongest when people and organizations come together to help vulnerable children. This was true when we partnered with Focus on the Family. We gave out 2,000 suitcases to foster families and child welfare agencies at four Suitcase Extravaganza events. We also partnered online and in person with Focus on the Family for several Wait No More events to start people on their own foster care journeys and share how anyone can create powerful wraparound care ministries.



## 16. We Can Take You Virtually Anywhere

We are praying 2022 includes more plane rides and bus trips to visit mission sites around the world, but in 2021, we made it easier for people to connect with children and our ministry partners in countries like Uganda and Guatemala. Participants received real-time ministry updates, learned about cultural norms, had the opportunity to pray together and make an impact long-term through child sponsorship.




## 17. New Language, Same Message

We made great strides to strengthen partnerships and begin new initiatives with Hispanic churches that will enable us to impact more children and families in a wide variety of cultural and community settings, in the United States and globally. We celebrated this new cultural collaboration at the Florida Baptist State Convention with a gathering of more than 1,000 Hispanic pastors and church leaders.



## 18. All Eyes on the Spotlights

When Super Bowl LV festivities came to Tampa, we partnered with the U.S. Institute Against Human Trafficking and Mission Hill Church to put the spotlight on how people can step up to fight against sex trafficking. Traffick Stop: Super Bowl Edition helped raise several hundred comfort kits for trafficking victims, and the event became One More Child's most watched livestream of all time.



## 13. A New Twist on College Meal Plans



It's an exhilarating sight to see energetic college students living out their faith by packing meals on campus to help fight hunger. Students at the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor in Belton, Texas, packed more than 18,000 meals to go directly to the 19 Title I schools in the area, and students at Union University in Jackson, Tennessee, packed nearly 7,400 meals to feed hungry children and struggling families we identified.



## 14. Florida Adoption Month



Since our founding in 1904, One More Child has advocated for children in need of loving families. In 2021, we continued spearheading efforts to end the wait for foster children in need. We initiated a resolution sponsored by Sen. Dennis Baxley and Rep. Michael Grant to designate November as Florida Adoption Month.

## 15. Seats at the Table

One More Child president/CEO, Dr. Jerry Haag, was honored to be elected as chairman of the Christian Alliance for Orphans (CAFO) and invited to be a member of the Forbes Nonprofit Council in 2021. It was also a privilege for One More Child to be the presenting sponsor for A Night of Hope and Healing hosted in Tampa by Florida Alliance to End Human Trafficking.



## 19. A Night at the Cove

We celebrated our acquisition of Orbie for Orphans with an amazing dinner, fundraiser and concert featuring members of the Dove Award-winning quartet, Avalon, at the Billy Graham Training Center at the Cove in North Carolina. In 2022, we are launching Maker's Box curriculum and craft kits to get the truth of God's Word in the hands of foster parents, single moms, One More Child clinicians and struggling families, as we take Orbie's decade of excellence and expect God to use it in new and powerful ways.

## 20. Seasons Giftings

Once again, One More Child rang in the holiday season by showering children and families with love and gifts, thanks to the incredible generosity of community partners and donors. Supporters like End Results Charities, who donated \$12,000 worth of gifts to our Lakeland campus, made it possible for us to share the miracle of Christmas with thousands of children.

For Stacy Johnson, the decision to foster came easily. As an education major, former nanny and mother of three, Stacy’s experience caring for children compelled her to say “yes” without hesitation. The opportunity to care for the “least of these” encouraged her through the licensing process. For Stacy’s husband, Gabe, however, the motivation was entirely different.

In every foster case, reunification is the goal. For Gabe, this became his “why.” His heart broke for the parents of children in foster care, especially the mother of his and Stacy’s two foster sons, Hazel.

The young woman had endured cycles of abuse that had sent her life spiraling out of control, and now, by God’s grace, she was facing a choice: to continue a path that might fracture her family permanently or accept the embrace of a loving family who wanted to support her in the journey to reunification.

With each visitation, the Johnsons shared the persistent love of Jesus, and over time, they developed a strong bond with Hazel. She began to open up to the Johnsons and came to rely on their encouragement. They prayed with her and supported her as she completed each goal to reunite with her sons. Even when Hazel became pregnant again and battled to resist former temptations, the Johnsons stood beside her.

Today, Hazel is allowing Jesus to mend the broken pieces of her soul. After years of praying for her

salvation, the Johnsons were overjoyed to stand next to Hazel as she was recently baptized in the ocean. At that moment, Stacy and Gabe say their decision to become foster parents came into focus: they realized clearly that their “yes” had been about Hazel all along.

- In 2020, more than 631,000 children were served in the foster care system in the United States.<sup>1</sup>
- The best place for a foster child is a safe, stable home with a family who will love them until permanent plans are established.
- Our expert, compassionate staff guides foster parent candidates through the licensing process.
- Caregiver support is a vital component of our approach to foster care. Our innovative Foster Crew model connects churches to the needs of foster families in their community.

## Here's the How:



- In 2020, the U.S. National Human Trafficking Hotline identified more than 10,800 victims of sex trafficking. Of those victims, nearly 30% were minors.<sup>1</sup>
- Our Anti-Trafficking Mobile Team, comprised of skilled clinicians, peer mentors and community advocates, collaborates regularly with law enforcement, child welfare and other agencies to recover sex trafficking victims in our communities and connect them to vital resources.
- Thanks to a grant from the Florida Attorney General's office, our Anti-Trafficking program expanded services into regions across Florida. In addition, we operate a state-certified safe home where we provide 24/7 services.
- We educate and train people to become advocates for trafficking survivors in their own communities through our Anti-Trafficking Front Line training events.

1. National Human Trafficking Hotline

After months of diligent study, the moment of truth had finally arrived for Suzanne\*. Carefully, she read the results that would prove if she had achieved her goal of obtaining her GED.

Years earlier, when she first began interacting with our Anti-Trafficking Mobile Team, Suzanne could not have been sure this moment would actually happen. She came to One More Child as a foster child, broken and untrusting, mostly due to the trauma she experienced as a teen trafficking survivor. Her journey to healing has included stops along our program's full continuum of care. From advocacy that helped her find placements in healthy environments, to mentorship with a fellow trafficking survivor, Suzanne has received the full support of our Anti-Trafficking team, who has invested the last several years into helping her adopt the life skills she needs to find stability and personal success for the long haul.

Determined to break generational cycles that nearly derailed her life, Suzanne set out to achieve her GED goal and threw herself into studying for the test. By God's grace, her efforts paid off. She passed every area of the test, achieving a notable goal for herself, all while exemplifying the powerful transformation that becomes possible when compassion and Christ-centered care align.

Cereal with water. It was all Darlene\* and Cole\* had to feed their family with no idea where they would get their next meal.

“Things were really tough for Cole and I,” she said. “We had no support, no food, no car, no job.”

Early in their relationship when things hit a rough patch, Darlene sought help to terminate a pregnancy. Instead, she found a local pregnancy center who assisted Darlene with choosing life for her child. Little Laney\* was born, and things began to look up for the young couple. Cole got a job at a warehouse, and although there were still financial challenges, the young family did its best to make ends meet. That was until COVID-19 hit, and Cole was laid off from his job.

When Darlene found herself pregnant again, she again sought help for an abortion until she remembered her friends at the pregnancy center. She reached out to them, and they referred her to One More Child, where Darlene and Cole received immediate help meeting their most urgent need – food.

Together, Darlene and Cole attended classes through our Family Support program. They received much-needed resources, including clothing, baby supplies and other household items. Most importantly to Darlene, who was not raised in a Christian home, she has learned how to talk with God and pray for her family.

## Here's the How:

- With a combination of expert staff, caring volunteers and partnerships with dedicated professionals and mentors, we focus on helping families in need become self-sufficient again.
- We provide resources such as clothing, food, diapers, tax preparation and more to families that meet requirements.
- Our family advocates provide regular one-on-one communication, skills development and support to families.
- In early 2021, we launched Jobs for Life, a program designed to help individuals gain life skills and professional development support through a dynamic Bible-based curriculum.
- One More Child Hope Street provides resources, food and spiritual support to families facing poverty and food insecurity in Tampa. In collaboration with the Department of Juvenile Justice, our youth mentoring program also provides a life-altering path for at-risk teens with 93% of the youth served successfully completing the program in Tampa and 90% in Pinellas County.

By the time she was 13, Kim\* had endured years of trauma from sexual abuse at the hands of a trusted family member. In efforts to camouflage the pain, Kim abused drugs, which led to an arrest and multiple charges. By the time she became a mom, Kim had become a drug addict and an inmate in jail, and she lost her love for life and God.

Eighteen months after her first child was born, Kim found herself pregnant with twins. Wanting desperately to create a family, Kim tried to make things work with her “on-again, off-again” drug-addicted boyfriend. He would get out of jail and stay sober for a while, only to relapse and be back in the penal system.

During one of her boyfriend's frequent binges, Kim packed her belongings and left for good. After that, she spent years in a cycle she refers to as a “rollercoaster.” She worked several jobs at a time, but never made any real headway in life. With each disappointment, Kim became more disillusioned and fell further away from God. She was working with an auctioneer company in 2020 when COVID-19 hit. Within a matter of weeks, she lost her job, her home and her car.

Kim sought help from the Salvation Army. While there, someone offered to pray with her, and a week later, Kim earned a job at a local retail store. The following week she joined our Single Moms program.

Today, Kim is working consistently and enjoying significant improvements in her relationship with her

children. She is learning to budget, and perhaps most rewarding, Kim is working to restore her relationship with God.

## Here's the How:



- Almost 23% of children under the age of 18 in the United States live in single-parent homes, the majority of them with a single mom.<sup>1</sup>
- In some cases, these mothers struggle to survive without a support system or extended family to help them during challenges.
- Many of our campuses have homes for single moms and their children to live for 9 to 12 months.
- Our program focuses on equipping single moms with skills to advance in their careers and to become better parents, as well as provide opportunities for spiritual and social growth.
- Churches partner with us to host Single Moms Community Programs to assist families in their community.



## Here's the How:



- We impact the lives of children in 13 countries, providing vital resources to support families in need.
- Through Child Sponsorship, you can provide necessities, such as food, education and medical care, to a child facing hardship for \$35 a month.
- We have built homes, schools, recreation centers and entire communities to ensure children around the world are able to thrive in safety and security.
- As of the end of 2021, we have resumed short-term missions to countries in Central America and South America, where individuals and groups can make a long-term impact in a variety of ways.

Imagine living in a community of isolation and abject poverty, while experiencing intimidation, discrimination, and sometimes, violence from neighboring citizens. For inhabitants of a village we serve in Romania, this is their daily experience.

Constance lives in a home in that village, where she takes care of her seven grandchildren. Their mother left them in her care so she could travel to another country to find work in order to pay for desperately-needed repairs to their home.

Recently, our ministry partners in Romania went to the home to let Constance know that one of the children had been sponsored. When they arrived at the door with food, Constance was heating a pot of water on the stove. The pot, however, was empty, because there wasn't any food. When she saw us, she began to sob.

She had been crying out and praying to God that morning because she had not been able to find any food to feed the kids. In a bold act of faith, she decided to put the pot on the stove, believing that somehow, someday, someone would bring them something to eat.

God answered her prayers that day through a One More Child sponsor. Between her sobs, she told us that these were tears of joy, because God provided sustenance for all of them that day and for many days to come.

Today, Geraldina is a beautiful and hardworking mother of three precious children, but her story nearly took a traumatic turn.

When she first met Jose and Coralia, our Pregnancy Ministry Partners in the Dominican Republic, she was desperate. Already caring for two children and expecting a third, Geraldina came to us determined to end her pregnancy. She had already terminated a pregnancy before, a decision that had created tension and fractured her family. Now, she was planning to do so again.

After trying unsuccessfully to end her pregnancy on her own with homemade concoctions and pills, Geraldina decided to place the baby for adoption.

She began visiting the pregnancy care center for vital care and resources, but with each visit, she gained much more. The staff prayed with her and encouraged her to stop hiding her pregnancy from her family and employer. They embraced Geraldina, and in turn, she began to embrace God's will for the life growing inside of her.

When her baby was born, Geraldina bravely decided to parent her child – a beautiful baby girl. Today, she continues to work and is finding balance as a single mother of three. However, she now faces the future with confidence, trusting that the same God who made a way for her to parent her baby is the same God who will continue to provide for her family.




