A LETTER FROM THE President

Years ago, I was sitting in chapel at seminary, listening to a message on James 1:27 (NIV): *“Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.”*

It Started with **ONE**

She walked through our doors in 1904, filled with uncertainty and desperately seeking safety. Juanita was the first, an orphan who had lost both parents and was left with godparents already overwhelmed by the burden of caring for their seven children. With nowhere else to turn, she found a home here. Her story marks the beginning of a mission that would grow to touch millions.

For more than 120 years, we have carried Juanita’s story in our hearts because once the Lord reveals His heart for the lost, the burden of their fear and longing becomes your own. And though it is heavy, our faithful volunteers, sacrificial donors, and tireless staff have carried each burden willingly and with joy.

Though it served 23 children in its first year, the mission that started with one child has grown into

a global movement, rippling through countless lives. Countless.

In 1938, 10-year-old Sarah and her younger brother tragically lost both their parents one after the other. Once surrounded by love and stability, they suddenly found themselves without a home or family. That was until they arrived at a small children’s home in Arcadia, FL. From that moment, they were cared for by people like you, moved by the Lord’s compassion to carry their burdens as their own.

Remarkably, one of the first children Sarah met that day would later become her husband. Together, they devoted nearly 50 years to advancing the mission of One More Child — building a thriving alumni community and helping to launch a Miami campus for what was then the Florida Baptist Children’s Home.

REACHING FARTHER

The **ONE MORE CHILD** ministry name is launched to recognize the many programs meeting the needs of vulnerable children and struggling families beyond the Florida borders.



MILLIONS OF MEALS

Our Child Hunger ministries expanded to reach millions of individuals through backpack meals for school children, meal packing events, food pantries, school partners, and more. While we provide help through each and every tangible meal, **ONE** more door opens for life change — emotionally, physically, and spiritually.



FAMILY SUPPORT

We formalized our prevention services, meeting urgent needs as well as providing support and training services, before the child welfare system intervenes and families are torn apart. Our Family Support program is making families stronger, **ONE** family at a time.

CHILDREN'S ALLIANCE FOR ORPHANS (CAFO) GLOBAL CONFERENCE

One More Child's international team marked a major milestone as global partners gathered in one place for the first time. Executive Director of Global Programs Alan Andrews and Guatemala National Director Alejandra Búrbano led a session on child protection, while Dr. Kathleen Pracht, Clinical Program Director, presented Anti-Trafficking 101 to Latin American partners.



ANTI-TRAFFICKING PRESS CONFERENCE

Dr. Jerry Haag, Chief Executive Officer of One More Child Foundation, joined Florida Lt. Gov. Jeanette Nuñez, DCF Secretary Shevaun Harris, and other leaders for a press conference highlighting the ongoing fight against human trafficking during National Human Trafficking Awareness Month.

A SPOTLIGHT ON ONE MORE CHILD'S ANTI-TRAFFICKING WORK

TRAFFICK STOP

One More Child advanced anti-trafficking advocacy through key engagements as part of the 2025 Traffick Stop initiative by meeting with legislators and attending the swearing-in of Florida Attorney General James Uthmeier. The campaign continues to drive awareness and action nationwide to protect children and prevent exploitation.





UNITED TO CHAMPION LIFE

Through its Sanctity of Human Life program, One More Child hosted its annual Sound the Call conference, a three-day summit uniting more than 200 attendees from churches, pregnancy care clinics, volunteers, and leaders to champion the sanctity of human life. The program also helped mobilize support to defeat Florida’s proposed Amendment 4 in the November election.

OHIO SINGLE MOMS GRADUATION

10TV Columbus spotlighted One More Child’s Single Moms Community Program as 12 mothers, ages 15 to 50, celebrated their graduation from the program in Ohio. Despite facing challenges like eviction and homelessness, participants received valuable life skills training and supportive mentorship.



PROTECTING CHILDREN ONLINE
One More Child launched its Online Safety video resource to equip parents and children with essential, life-saving digital safety strategies to recognize digital dangers and protect against human trafficking. The 4-part video course is available for free at onemorechild.org/onlinesafety.

THE SOUND OF HOPE AT MUSEUM OF THE BIBLE

Bishop W.C. Martin — whose church’s powerful foster care story inspired the 2024 film “Sound of Hope: The Story of Possum Trot” — was among several noted guests who joined One More Child at the Museum of the Bible in Washington, D.C. The event featured a special tour led by Steve and Jackie Green, chairman of the museum board and owners of Hobby Lobby.

PROCLAIMING DIGNITY AT LOFT 181

Hillsborough County Commissioner Donna Cameron-Cepeda honored One More Child’s Loft 181 with a formal commendation during a special event. The recognition celebrated the boutique’s ongoing impact in restoring dignity and confidence to survivors of human trafficking and children in foster care through tailored support, compassionate care, and the hope of the Gospel.



HOUSTON FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER CELEBRATES ONE YEAR
Celebrating one year of service, One More Child’s Houston Family Resource Center continues to strengthen local families by offering parenting classes, personal support, and connections to local resources that meet needs before crises arise.

STARS HIT THE GREEN TO SUPPORT SURVIVORS

Golf legends Paul Azinger and Gary Koch teamed up with football greats Ronde Barber and Vinny Testaverde to host the second annual celebrity golf tournament. The event raised \$235,000 to benefit One More Child's Anti-Trafficking program and the Florida Human Trafficking Victim's Fund.



EXPANDING CARE, ONE SMILE AT A TIME

In partnership with AdventHealth and Sharing Smiles, One More Child opened a new dental clinic in Guatemala. The launch builds on a 14-year collaboration providing critical health care, now expanding to meet urgent dental needs for children and families in the region.

ANTI-TRAFFICKING AWARENESS AT TEXAS A&M

One More Child partnered with Texas A&M University and the Mike Evans Family Foundation to deliver more than 7,000 meals to Cypress Grove Intermediate School. That evening, students, parents, and local residents were invited to hear One More Child leaders and partners share valuable information on how to “See it, Say it, and Stop it,” equipping the campus and surrounding community to recognize and respond to human trafficking.



FOSTERING HOPE AT WOMEN OF COMPASSION

More than 300 women gathered at the annual Women of Compassion luncheon to bolster the work of One More Child. This year, they raised nearly \$140,000 to aid foster children and families in our care.



TRAFFICKING SURVIVOR WINS CAR

After completing career and vocational training through One More Child's Anti-Trafficking program, a survivor was nominated for a vehicle through the National Auto Body Council's Recycled Rides program. With a new job at Disney and a determination to build a brighter future, she was awarded a car, providing the transportation she needs to care for her children and get to work.



TRANSFORMING LIVES IN THE VOLUNTEER STATE

Our Tennessee team continues to see powerful transformation in the lives of those we serve, from a middle school client who accepted Christ after attending summer camp with a One More Child ministry partner to a mom receiving advocacy from our team, which allowed her to reunite with her two daughters. These stories reflect the faith-driven, holistic care happening every day across the region.

12,000 MEALS FOR HUNGRY CHILDREN

Church on Bayshore partnered with One More Child to host 80 volunteers who packed 12,000 meals, benefiting nine local schools and organizations. In just 90 minutes, every meal was packed, including a handwritten note with Scripture, showing the great impact we can make when people come together with purpose and compassion.



GROUNDBREAKING GROWTH ON THE JOE K. BLANTON CAMPUS

One More Child broke ground on a major expansion of its global headquarters in Lakeland, Florida. Planned developments include six new single mom homes and a 20,000-square-foot Grounds for Grace Center. During the ceremony, Lakeland Mayor William Mutz issued an official proclamation naming June 17, 2025 “One More Child Day.”



METRO-ATLANTA SINGLES MOBILIZE FOR TRAFFICKING SURVIVORS

Apex Christian Singles hosted a packing party to assemble over 150 Comfort Kits for survivors of human sex trafficking. Each kit was thoughtfully filled with hygiene essentials, offering tangible resources as a connection point to reach individuals in the grip of sexual exploitation.



WHERE SERVING IS A PLEASURE

Over 50 Publix volunteers rolled up their sleeves at One More Child’s Lakeland headquarters for Publix Serves Week — beautifying outdoor spaces, sorting donations, cleaning warehouse space, and painting two homes for single moms. Their hard work, even in the rain, made a lasting impact.

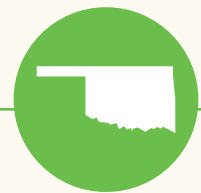

Foster Children

With four children between the ages of 2 and 9, the Pearson* home was constantly bustling with activity. Still, Hope* and Tom* Pearson felt God tugging at their hearts to care for more children through foster care.

Hope and Tom became licensed foster parents with One More Child seven years prior, with plans to foster one child at a time. Evan* was their first placement. Coming to them two days before his first birthday, he stayed with the Pearsons for 13 months before reunifying with his family. A few weeks after accepting another placement, they learned Evan needed to reenter foster care and immediately welcomed him back into their home.

Evan spent the next two years as their foster child until adoption became possible. Hope and Tom joyfully made it official, welcoming him as a forever member of the Pearson clan.

Now, with five children, the Pearsons continued their call to foster, seeing many children through to reunification. **One day, they received a call about twin babies, asking if they could care for one, as there was not a home that could take both.** Hope and Tom were heartbroken at the thought of separating them, so they decided to foster both babies.

After the twins reunified, the Pearsons continued fostering sibling sets of two. Then came a call about a group of three siblings. The licensing specialist asked if they could take the two youngest, while the oldest was placed elsewhere. They agreed, but as they loved and cared for these two children, the thought of the separated older sister weighed heavily on them.

The next morning, they asked to foster the oldest sister as well, making space in their home and hearts for all three siblings. That space remained open, because less than a month after these siblings reunified with their mom, two more foster babies arrived: 3-month-old twins who had tragically suffered physical abuse before entering foster care, now experiencing extraordinary love and healing in the Pearsons' care.

Over the past seven years, Hope and Tom have fostered 19 children, including six sibling groups, and their adopted son, Evan.

They began their foster care journey to help one child at a time — but along the way, their yes to one more became a yes to many more.

Trafficking Survivors

Tessa's* story was one of exploitation, suffering, and isolation.

One More Child's Anti-Trafficking team met Tessa during a nine-day collaborative human trafficking sting operation with the Sheriff's Office in Polk County, Florida. This operation ultimately led to 244 arrests and connected our experts to many potential survivors.

Tessa was one of these survivors.

Her trafficker maintained control through constant coercion and the looming threat of violence. Haunted by memories of other victims suffering physical abuse, she was forced into exploitative encounters with men who paid her trafficker, understanding that physical violence awaited her if she refused to comply. **This was her past, her present, and she believed it was her future.**



But everything began to change when she was pulled from her abusive situation during the human trafficking special undercover operation: "Fool Around and Find Out." That same night, she was placed in a hotel for safety. In the quiet hours that followed, she sat there — overwhelmed, replaying what just happened, and wondering what could possibly come next.

We never left Tessa's side. We sat with Tessa and began working with her on a plan for her future. We mobilized support immediately, making phone calls and connecting her with resources to set her on a path towards physical, emotional, and spiritual healing.

Our team connected with a shelter that was farther away so that Tessa would not have to stay in a location where her trafficker might look for her. **During her intake call with the shelter, the manager asked if she had anyone in her life she could rely on for support.**

Tessa took a long pause and a deep breath. Then she looked around at our team, and quietly, but confidently said... "I do now."

No survivor of human trafficking should ever have to walk alone — and now, Tessa doesn't have to.

Our team will continue to walk alongside Tessa on her road to healing, providing mental health counseling and helping her navigate legal matters related to her trafficking situation.

Tessa was once trapped in a cycle of abuse, living in constant fear of violence and retribution. Today, she is one more who has hope, support, and a path to freedom.

Single Moms

When Patricia walked into a One More Child parenting class at a church in Columbus, Ohio, she was taking a foundational step toward creating a new life for herself and her infant son. A single mother navigating homelessness, trauma, and untreated mental health challenges, she carried far more than a full diaper bag. But she came willing to do whatever it took to provide a safe, loving future for her 9-month-old child.

Her courage became the cornerstone in the life she is working to build for her family. But like every vulnerable family we serve, Patricia's story did not begin at the church doors.

We first met her while delivering diapers and bus passes to a local family shelter. That simple encounter led to a deeper conversation about her circumstances and an invitation to join the parenting class at one of our trusted community partner locations. There, she found a welcoming space to learn, a food pantry, and a free store stocked with resources that meet urgent, essential needs for Patricia and others like her.

Despite all she was facing, Patricia showed up to the parenting class week after week. In time, she shared that she had been off her medication for a diagnosed mental health condition, something that was affecting her stability and ability to care for her son. With encouragement from the One More Child team, she took steps to restart treatment and access consistent care. **Patricia did the work as One More Child provided the support she needed to achieve her goals.**

As her health stabilized, Patricia turned her focus to housing. She had previously been living in a broken-down car with her son before finding temporary shelter. While the shelter offered a measure of relief, **Patricia longed to give her child something more: a place of their own.** With guidance from her newfound support system, she navigated the complex housing system, kept every appointment, and completed the necessary paperwork — even in the middle of a snowy Ohio winter. **After three months of persistence, Patricia and her baby boy moved into their first apartment together.**

Like many of the single moms we walk alongside, Patricia's transformation is generational. When we first met her son, he was 9-months-old, significantly underweight, and behind on developmental milestones. Patricia had done everything she could to care for him with the little she had, but now that she was receiving the assistance she needed, like donated breast milk — he began to thrive.

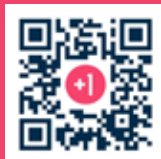
Now, Patricia is working toward employment and building a village of support. She has connected with other mothers from the parenting class and is visiting a local church.

Our prayer is that these early steps — diapers, parenting classes, medical care, housing — will ultimately lead to eternal transformation, rooted in something far greater than anything we could offer. And through Patricia's transformation, others are witnessing what is possible when even the hardest beginnings are placed in God's hands.

Struggling Families

Within a span of two weeks, Hurricanes Helene and Milton wreaked havoc across communities in the southeastern United States, resulting in widespread devastation, heartbreaking loss, and heightened struggles. Even before the impact of the storms was realized, our teams began mobilizing to aid affected communities. With our extensive resources, community and church partnerships, and comprehensive support services, One More Child was uniquely equipped to serve vulnerable children and struggling families amid the crisis.

Launching hurricane relief efforts in Florida, North Carolina, and Tennessee, One More Child offered critical aid, distributing 75 semi-truckloads of supplies, 3 million pounds of food, and 3.6 million meals.

As hundreds of cars passed through our parking lots, our team took time to pray and connect with as many families as possible. For some, this included receiving a gas gift card, generously donated by the local Central Florida business, Nick and Moe's. **While the gift card was an added blessing for most, for Melody* it was more than a blessing. It was an answered prayer.**

Still reeling from the hurricane's aftermath, Melody learned about One More Child's distribution event and longed to attend, as she desperately needed diapers for her children. But one thing stood in her way: she was nearly out of gas. Unsure whether she had enough to make the round trip, she wrestled with the decision but ultimately concluded that her need outweighed the risk. She prayed to God and asked for help before leaving that morning. A few hours later, her answer came.

When One More Child Chief Financial Officer Kim Bedwell presented Melody with the gift card, she immediately broke down in tears, realizing this was the answer to her prayer. Kim listened to Melody's story and prayed with her through an open car window. **Melody received more than tangible support; she left with spiritual encouragement and renewed hope in a God who hears her most desperate prayers.**

As we work to meet the widespread needs of many, moments like these remind us that God's immeasurable love extends to each and every one. Our responsibility is to reflect that love by showing up with compassion, caring for the unique needs of every vulnerable child and struggling family, and pointing each person to the eternal hope of Christ.

Hungry Children

The lunchroom at Jesse Keen Elementary School holds more than the noise of midday chatter and the scent of cafeteria food. It carries stories — quiet ones — that speak volumes about the realities children face beyond the classroom walls. Lisa, a teacher at the school, noticed two brothers who had developed an unusual habit. **Each day, they left part of their lunch untouched — not out of dislike or waste, but out of need.**

They were rationing their meals, saving food for the weekend. For children living with food insecurity, the end of the school week can feel like a cliff. Monday through Friday, the free and reduced lunch program offers some consistency. But by Friday afternoon, the guarantee of the next meal disappears, replaced by uncertainty and an all-too-familiar hunger for nourishment and a brighter future.

This practice of saving food had become the brothers' weekly routine, but then something happened that changed this habit. They no longer hoard crackers

or wrap half-eaten sandwiches in napkins. Now, these same brothers eat every bite of their lunch, thanks to a small bag that brought a big assurance that they wouldn't go hungry over the weekend.

Every Friday, they receive a Backpack Meal — a bag filled with enough meals to carry them through the weekend until Monday. Tucked inside this bag is a handwritten note, penned by selfless volunteers who know that these children are packing more than food away in their backpacks. They are packing hope.

“We are very grateful for this program,” Lisa said. “We are feeding as many as we can, and it improves overall student attendance and behavior when they know they can get food for the weekends. Also, the little notes make so many of these children smile.”

It is a small gesture but a powerful reminder that sometimes, the most important part of the school day does not happen during a lesson. It happens when children are fed, seen, and supported.





Global Communities

As a dedicated mother of two in South Asia, Nila* worked three jobs to provide for her family. Even with her husband's and her incomes combined, the financial struggles seemed never-ending. Despite their efforts, they could not afford resources that would improve their lives. One daily burden was cooking over a traditional stove that could only prepare one meal at a time and required firewood.

Nila felt isolated in her struggle, knowing that despite their hard work, it never seemed to be enough. **Then Nila got connected with a savings group at her church, and she experienced hope and support like never before.**

In South Asia, savings groups are church-based initiatives in which participants agree to save a small amount of their income and make it accessible to others within their group if a financial need arises. In partnership with our local ministry partners in South Asia, One More Child provides trainings and materials needed to facilitate the groups. **However, the groups are self-led by community members, helping promote self-sufficiency, financial stability, and community development.**

In addition, about 90% of participants in the savings groups are women, offering an opportunity for empowerment, education, and belonging in a culture that generally perceives women to have little value.

When women in a savings group come together to provide a loan, the support uplifts the individual in need, while strengthening the bonds within the community and fostering a sense of unity and shared responsibility.

This was the case for Nila. Familiar with her struggles, the women in her group rallied around her and provided a small loan to purchase a gas stove for cooking.



With tears of gratitude, Nila thanked the group for believing in her and giving her the tools to change her life. **As these women continue to grow and support one another, they are discovering hope in Jesus Christ and the power to uplift their communities.**

GOVERNMENT AND LEGISLATION

One More Child continues to work hand in hand with state and federal law enforcement agencies to help human trafficking survivors and prevent child exploitation. This year, One More Child leadership was invited to attend the **swearing-in ceremony of Florida's new Attorney General, James Uthmeier**.



Gov. Ron DeSantis reappointed Dr. Haag to the **Florida Faith and Community Advisory Council**, which advises the Governor's Office and Legislature. It marks his fifth appointment to the council, having served under three different governors.

ADVOCACY AND PARTNERSHIPS



Dr. Haag and Christi, along with One More Child COO Jodi Domangue, presented a **multi-year plan to provide services in Oklahoma City in partnership with Steve and Jackie Green** (Hobby Lobby). Steve and Jackie Green were recently recognized with the One More Child Ambassador Award in recognition of their personal mission to advance the Gospel and prioritize the care of vulnerable children.



Dr. Haag presented at his alma mater as part of the **Baylor Collaborative Hunger & Poverty Summit**, where executive leadership from One More Child joined leaders from across the country to discuss the root causes of hunger and how to transform lives in the name of Christ.

Dr. Haag and Christi presented words of inspiration from their time in ministry as One More Child hosted the **2025 Baptist Coalition of Children and Families (BCCF) Conference** in Orlando, Florida, which included 45 ministry leaders from 11 states.



During this year's **Christian Alliance for Orphans (CAFO) Leadership Retreat**, Dr. Haag introduced Stephen Robert as the new President and CEO of One More Child to child welfare leaders representing organizations from across the nation.



Dr. Anthony George, Senior Pastor of **First Baptist Church of Atlanta**, invited One More Child leadership to host an Anti-Trafficking conference and speak during their worship services. Dr. Haag had the opportunity to preach from the very pulpit where the late Rev. Charles Stanley ministered for 49 years.



Dr. Haag was among 25 secular and faith-based thought leaders selected to engage in the largest **global study of human flourishing**, sponsored by Harvard University, Templeton Foundation, Gallop, and Baylor Institute for the Study of Religion. This study, which has been tracked for more than five years, includes more than 200,000 participants from 22 countries. Dr. Haag and Christi made key contacts and established relationships that are already being leveraged for future partnerships.



Dr. Haag presented to foundation presidents from across the nation at the **Foundation Presidents Gathering** in historic St. Augustine, Florida. Other presenters included Hance Dillbeck, CEO of Guidestone, and Dr. Jeff Iorg, President and CEO of the Southern Baptist Convention Executive Committee.
