This is the most fundamental part of our ministry: to bring children from a life of crisis to a life with Christ. Last year we served 8,673 children and families with our services. This is a 67% increase in the number of children and families served over 2008. 2009 HIGHLIGHTS

- † We launched the new Safe Families program in partnership with Christ Fellowship Church in Ft. Lauderdale and First Baptist Church of Jacksonville.
- † We continued to strengthen our foster care program and other community ministries by adding a new ministry location in Clearwater in partnership with Calvary Baptist Church.
- † We broke ground on a new care home for developmentally delayed adults on our Ft. Myers Campus. This ministry to God's special children is being done in partnership with Protected Harbor, McGregor Baptist Church, and Royal Palm Baptist Association.
- † We launched the Mission Backpack program in partnership with Moody Radio

- and Orphan Outreach to collect more than 4,000 backpacks for disadvantaged children in Florida and in the developing world such as Guatemala, Honduras, and Haiti.
- † We partnered with nearly 200 pregnancy care centers across the state to strengthen efforts to reach more young women experiencing an unplanned pregnancy and guiding them to a life-affirming decision for their unborn child.
- † We partnered with numerous churches, organizations, families, and individuals to go to the ends of the earth on one of our 21 international childcare mission trips to help some of the world's poorest and neediest children.
