

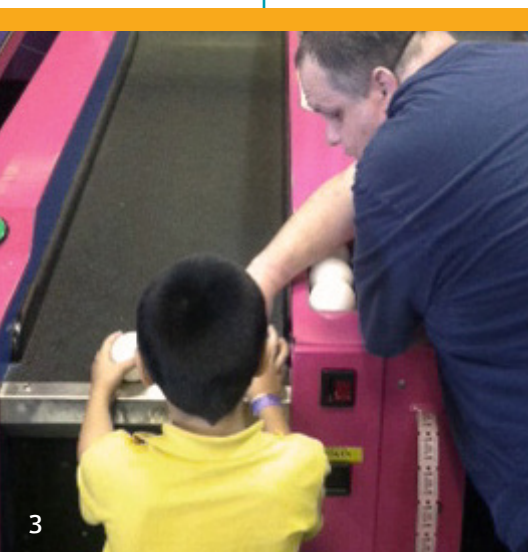
MY LIFE CHANGED IN 2014: 6-YEAR-OLD TREY'S ADOPTION STORY

RESIDENTIAL & EMERGENCY CARE

In 2014, we offered loving homes to 302 children through our residential and emergency care. Many of these children had experienced unthinkable family trauma and abuse, but were able to thrive in the family care setting offered at FBCH.

ABOUT OUR CARE

Each of our homes has loving house parents who work to bring new stability into the lives of children in care! Up to eight children live in each of our cottages, and because of help from you, the pantry is always full, clothes are always the right size and grace is always given. Relationships between children and their biological families are fostered and encouraged (when appropriate and allowed by the courts). Each child in care is provided with a life that is as normal as possible given the difficult situations from which they were removed. Our residential campuses have the support of family counselors and social workers, helping many of the children in care overcome traumatic life circumstances.

Our Emergency Care shelter is open 24-hours-a-day, 7-days-a-week, ready to care for children facing sudden trauma or abandonment, no matter what time of the day or night it may be.

ONE MORE CHILD CHANGED THROUGH RESIDENTIAL CARE

*Cameron grew up in a home where drugs and alcohol were more important than school, dinner and time with his single mother. When he came to live on one of FBCH's campuses, his house parents understood his anger and frustrations. They were surprised and thankful for his openness to attend church. One day, Cameron made the decision to follow Christ and changes began. His relationship with other children in the cottage and at his new school started to grow. He even gained the confidence to try out for the basketball team. All of those praying for Cameron were elated to learn that he made the team. Cameron's life has changed because of Jesus and the stability he has found at Florida Baptist Children's Homes!

THROUGH OUR FOSTER CARE, ORPHAN CARE MINISTRIES AND ADOPTIVE SERVICES, WE IMPACTED THE LIVES OF 894 CHILDREN! THESE ARE AMONG THE HIGHLIGHTS:

- In 2014, 704 children were placed in loving Christian foster homes. Also, through our Foster Family Homes, we were able to keep more brothers and sisters together throughout the state and expanded this model of care in Gainesville, Jacksonville, Bradenton and Lakeland.
- In 2014, we doubled our adoption staff to better serve families and place more children in forever homes! We also launched our photo gallery for some of the children waiting to be adopted. ORPHAN'S HEART: LOVE WITHOUT BORDERS

Last year, Orphan's Heart, our international child care ministry, joyfully served **36,981 CHILDREN** and families in **12 DEVELOPING NATIONS.**



A total of **1,164 individuals** from all over the nation participated in life-changing mission experiences through Orphan's Heart to countries like Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Latvia, Nicaragua and Uganda.

ONE MORE CHILD CHANGED THROUGH A CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

December 1, 2014, Orphan's Heart launched an expanded child sponsorship program where individuals, churches and groups can sponsor a child for \$35 a month – providing food, clothes, medicine, educational supplies and more for a child in a developing nation. Currently, **765** children are sponsored and **527** are waiting to be sponsored. Lives are being changed through the sponsorship program!

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC COMMUNITY TRANSFORMED

Sadly, there are millions in the Dominican Republic living below the national poverty line, including precious children who have overwhelming physical and medical needs. In 2014, Orphan's Heart completed the Community Transformation Center in El Carrizal, where the locals now worship and gather as a community. Since the opening of the center, which was purposely built in the heart of the city, children come from afar to hear Bible stories and learn about Jesus. Orphan's Heart teams are continuing to build homes for families in El Carrizal!

In 2014, Florida Baptist Children's Homes launched The Porch Light to help innocent girls victimized by domestic sex trafficking. Through our safe home program, as well as prevention and advocacy efforts across the state, we were able to impact more than 14,600 lives during the first year of the program.

An unexpected highlight for our first safe home was the gift of a beautiful horse named Star (opposite page). Caring for Star has been therapeutic for the girls and a refreshing respite from the trauma they have experienced.

We were amazed at the response of the body of Christ as we asked for prayer for these vulnerable girls! Churches prayed with us and hosted their own 24-hour prayer vigils. Women's groups from across the state also collected more than 1,000 backpacks that are being used domestically and internationally by child victims of sex trafficking. Thank you to churches like First Baptist Lake Wales for your compassion and willingness to act on behalf of innocent children!

ONE MORE CHILD CHANGED THROUGH THE PORCH LIGHT

One of the precious girls in The Porch Light safe home made the choice one evening to run away. We were prepared to face such a circumstance, as statistics indicate that the majority of girls removed from sex trafficking attempt to return to the life they knew. After several nights, this child chose to come back on her own. On the morning she returned, she was found curled up sleeping peacefully on the front porch swing.

In the coming year, we look forward to the ways God will continue to use The Porch Light to help many more innocent children!

SHINE A LIGHT

In October, we hosted Shine a Light: The Porch Light Weekend – a 5K run, family festival and formal gala event featuring international recording artist Jason Castro!

Because of our incredible participants and corporate sponsors, we raised \$330,389 for The Porch Light. Thank you to more than 20 corporate sponsors like DeBartolo Development, LLC (photo, right), who simply said "yes" when asked if they would help make a difference for these innocent children.

The Porch Light's safe home was awarded the Polaris Star Housing Award at the 7th Annual Human Trafficking Awareness Day. The Florida Public Relations Association recognized The Porch Light with a Golden Image Award for our marketing and branding efforts.

SANCTITY OF HUMAN LIFE

Over the past year, FBCH partnered with pregnancy care centers to reach more women experiencing unplanned pregnancies and guide them to make life-affirming decisions for their unborn children. We traveled all over the state with our mobile pregnancy care center, which provides ultrasound screenings, counseling and other services to underserved communities throughout Florida!

OVERALL, WE SERVED 3,633 INDIVIDUALS THRO

Through our compassion ministries, we touched the lives of 45,830 individuals by meeting their physical needs for food, household items, clothes, baby supplies and more.

One of the exciting highlights of our compassion ministries expansion in 2014 was piloting a new backpack program in Jacksonville! Working with a Title I school, in which 100 percent of the children are impoverished, allowed us to provide these amazing children with meals – so they do not go hungry during the weekends.



DIAPER DRIVE!

During the fall of 2014, we conducted our fifth annual diaper drive, in conjunction with Orphan Sunday, to help meet the needs of children! Each month, we use more than 30,000 diapers to provide for babies in care! This past year, churches throughout the state rallied around us to help us exceed our goal of **350,000** diapers! These diapers are used for babies in foster care as well as internationally. Thank you to the hundreds of churches and individuals who helped make this happen, including First Baptist Church of Chipley who collected thousands of diapers (photo shown, right).

This past year, we had nearly **86,000** volunteer hours given toward our domestic and international ministries – a 21 percent increase from the year before! This is the equivalent of **41** full-time staff members. Through the gift of time, our volunteers are making a tremendous difference for children in tangible ways.

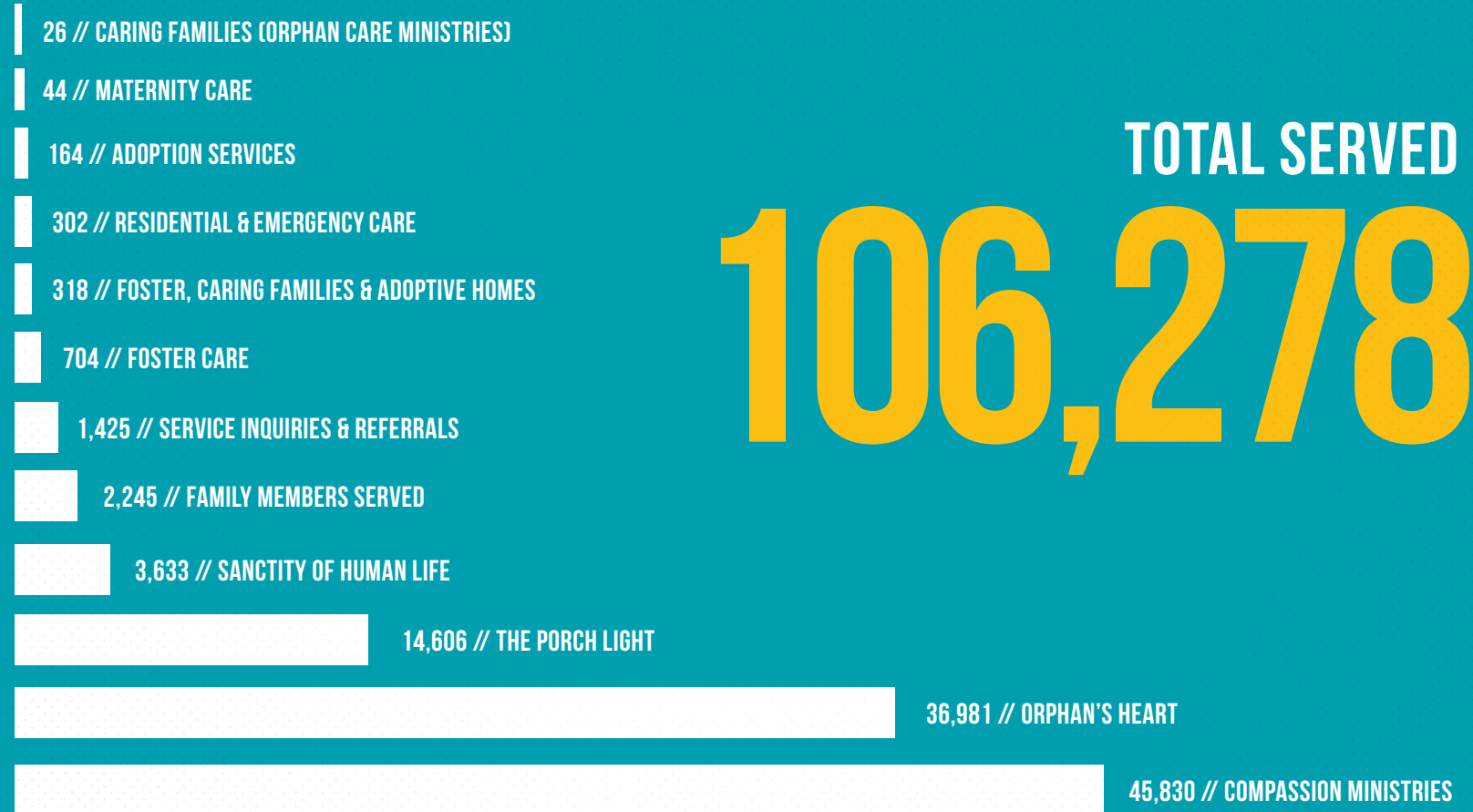

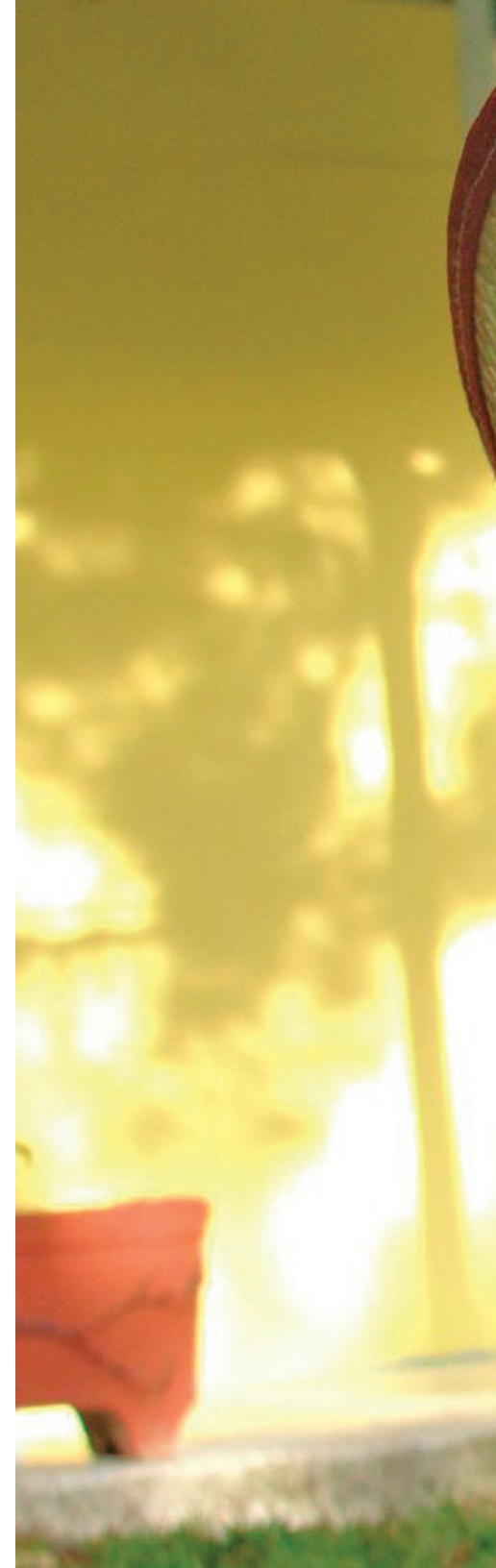

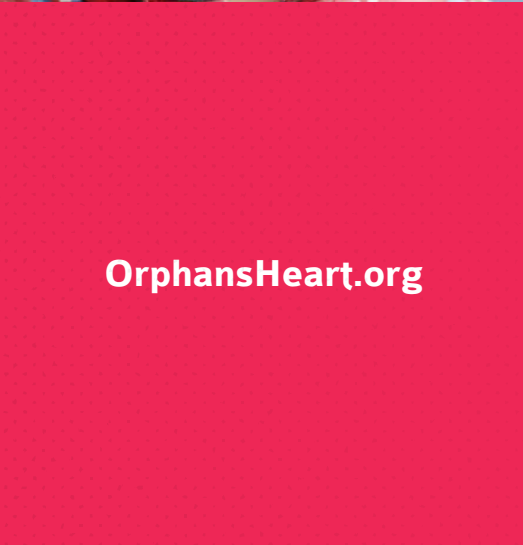
